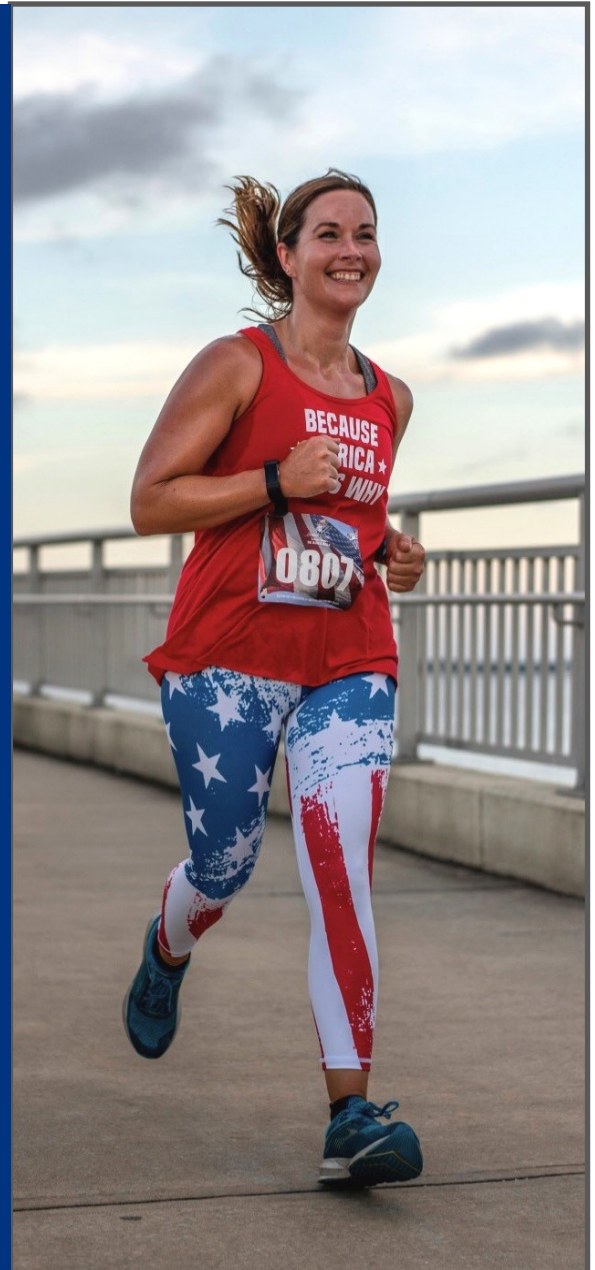

What's New in Emergency Management

- Over the past few weeks, EM staff have been busy with severe Spring weather, including flash flood warnings, tornado warnings, strong wind gusts, and severe thunderstorm warnings. Elsewhere in the state, there were at least 15 confirmed tornadoes that touched down in a single day in April.
- During the last week of March, EM staff attended the Virginia Emergency Management Symposium where our Virginia Commonwealth University Intern received the Addison Slayton Jr. Scholarship. According to the Virginia Emergency Management Association, the scholarship was established in recognition of “the importance of education in promoting emergency management.”
- On April 10th, the Emergency Management Coordinator and supporting staff led the Emergency Management Executive Committee Meeting, a quarterly update for agency directors and their designees on current and emerging emergency management projects and plans in the county.
- EM staff attended the National Capital Region Complex Coordinated Attack Symposium in Washington, D.C., on April 23rd.
- This month, EM staff said farewell to Nick Drauschak, Regional Emergency Management Planner. Nick shared his knowledge, expertise, and common-sense approach with county, state, and regional partners to help address many mass-care and access and functional needs issues over the past year. His lively personality and uncanny ability to do celebrity impressions will be missed, but we are happy for him and the opportunity that he was able to pursue.

On Wednesday, April 10th, Police Chief Barry Barnard and Fire and Rescue Acting Chief Tim Keen formally recognized Department of Fire and Rescue employees selected to be part of the Prince William County Fire and Rescue System SWAT Medic Pilot Program. Department of Fire and Rescue employees selected for this joint program with the Prince William County Police Department include Lieutenant Kyle Cirillo, Lieutenant Matthew Stewart, Technician II David Rossi, and Technician II Sara Sproule.
