VCE offers classes to equip adults to raise, nurture, and strengthen family relationships. The Systematic Training for Effective parenting classes is available to adults of young children, school age children, and teens. In addition, we offer a When Families Get Angry class which focuses on understanding anger in the family and the Juvenile Justice Parenting Program for parents who have a teen exhibiting at-risk behavior or may become court involved. All programs are also offered in Spanish.
